

# <u>Context</u>

In the Summer term we asked families to respond to an online Family Survey (sent to families via email along with the annual student reports). 27 families completed the survey. This is 9 more families than the previous year.

At the time of completion, the school was open to Year EY, 1, 6 and 'Cool Club' key workers. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, some additional questions have been posed to help future plans if a blended curriculum is required. The format of the online survey required two children to be completed every time, even if only one child attends. This was taken into account and each response analysed separately to remove the data for a second sibling where it was made clear they nott exist (within the comments section). Therefore the data analysed is deemed an accurate overview of the responses gained.

# TOTAL SURVEYS RECEIVED at last count: 27

(354 pupil son roll) 8% of families responded to the survey (this is 2% higher than the previous survey and the highest response rate to date.)

# Summer 2020 Family Survey Results

Responding to Covid – of the 27 families who responded, 1 family does not have access to daily internet and suggested they would contact the office as suggested, in the likelihood of a second lockdown.

Overall the feedback is positive with 67% of families **still** agreeing with all the statements. 100% of the responses agree that '*The school promotes a broad and balanced range of subjects*'.

93% of families think that their child is happy at school and enjoys coming. Although this is slightly less than in the Autumn term (1 pupil), they are not currently attending school. 85% of families also said that St Catherines' supports their child to achieve a good standard of work and 93% said that there is a good range of extra curricular activities that interest our pupils. Although this is slightly lower than last year, it must be taken into consideration that school is currently closed to some pupils.

74% of families feel that behavioural issues are dealt with promptly and appropriately which was considered when reviewing the behaviour policy and therapeutic approach introduced in September 2019 – this has increased by 3%. When including those with no opinion, 2 responses (7%) disagree. Please speak with the class teacher or a member of staff if you are concerned with any behaviour issues.

Only 67% of families feel that their child is adequately stretched at school. This has not changed since the Sept survey. This will be a school, national and local focus when children return to school and 'get back on track' in the Autumn term. The re-structuring of a school wide Inclusion team will help us to provide more class based support so that all children have what they need to make progress.

## **Responding to Covid-19**

78% of families who responded feel their child has continued to learn during the pandemic, 85% have felt supported and part of the school community whilst maintaining communication though the virtual platforms.

In the event of a 'blended' curriculum, more information has been gained as to the 'type of learning' specific year groups have accessed during the school closures. This will help us to prepare more specifically for individual year groups and consider the amount of online learning families can access within a daily period.

## Progress since last year;

Last year 79% of families thought they had a clear indication of what was being taught, this year that has continued to rise and is now 93%. Communication with families has continued to improve with families stating 'Communication is much better,' the admin office they are very hard working they listen to parents when you bring in any complaints' and 'It has been great that the weekly newsletters have remained and the general communication from school has been very good. As soon as there was a new announcement from the govt, this would be followed by comms from the St Caths so we were never left wondering what the situation was.'

At the beginning of this academic year, 81% of families felt the classes public exhibitions had a positive impact for them and their child. This year, this has declined to 74%. Providing the children an opportunity to express what they have learned to an authentic audience is a key aspect to our project-based approach to the curriculum when school reopens to all in September.

- Maybe some lessons via Zoom would have been better at some point.
- St Cath's would be even better if the 'star of the week' and 'good news' notes had continued and possibly posted. It would have been a boost for the kids to receive these in the post.
- Exhibitions... My child queued up and walked around the whole exhibition with me but none of their work was included, so they were extremely upset
- My child could do with additional help in the classroom that cannot possibly be provided by one teacher
